

History

On September 19, 1930, Kathryn Fingado-O'Neil, wife of Charles I. O'Neil, generously donated forty acres on the west shore of Flathead Lake to Kalispell First Presbyterian Church. This donation made it possible to begin serving the Flathead Valley youth through a summer conference.

The principal figures in the establishment of the camp were Rev. Frank B. Hillis and C. D. O'Neil. Rev. Hillis was a skilled carpenter and Mr. O'Neil owned a lumber mill. Together they helped build the first structures on the site. It was a primitive arrangement, but fun was had by all where campers would swim, play ball games and be disciplined by church leaders. It is appropriate to say that Glacier Camp was created out of the faith and commitment of these two mutually supportive men who inspired Mrs. Kathryn Fingado-O'Neil to donate the initial forty acres of land on which to build this beautiful camp.

This camp is here because of people like Mrs. Fingado-O'Neil. The people who have gone before us to make this a place that fosters positive life changes are the reason we're here today. We invite you to be a part of the powerful story of God's Kingdom unfolding here at Glacier Camp...one relationship at a time.

Since 1931, Glacier Camp (now owned by Glacier Presbytery) has helped tens of thousands of children and youth from Montana discover their leadership potential, build relationships and grow in their faith. Glacier Camp is all about providing fun and meaningful Christ-centered camp and retreat experiences and offering a space where groups can meet in a gorgeous natural environment.

Alcohol Policy: If any of the Wedding events involves alcoholic beverages, the alcohol policy shall be signed and adhered to with an additional damage deposit.

Cancellation Policy: If cancellation occurs between the time of agreement and up to six months prior to event, 50% of deposit will be forfeited. If cancellation occurs less than four months prior to the event, 100% of the deposit will be forfeited. If cancellation occurs within three months of event, 50% of the guaranteed total is required. If cancellation occurs within one month of event, 75% of the guaranteed total is required. If cancellation occurs less than one month prior to event, 90% of the guaranteed amount will be required.

Food Service Policy: AS GLACIER CAMP IS A FOOD SERVICE PROVIDER THERE IS NO KITCHEN USE AVAILABLE FOR GUEST GROUPS. Food Service guarantee for overnight guests is required 14 days prior to event.

Reservation Policy: A deposit of 25% of the minimum guarantee which is applied to the final bill and signed Contract.

Glacier Presbytery Camp (GPC) is a not-for-profit religious organization owned and operated by the Glacier Presbytery and a camp and conference facility. All facilities provided are intended for the purpose of glorifying God. Families are a wonderful gift from God. Glacier Camp is an ideal location to bring the treasures of Northwest Montana and families together.

The Spruce Lodge is a log cabin-style facility built in 2004 — ideal for group retreats, family gatherings and celebrations. Facilities within the lodge include:

- 13 lodging rooms, each of which has a private full bath and contains 2 extra long twin beds, (some have a queen bed in place of one of the twin beds) 1 bunk bed and (some rooms have) a futon. This allows up to 4 people per room.
- 2 conference rooms which can seat 100, 50 people respectively. The lodge also has a library and fireside room.
- Over 10,000 sq. feet of wraparound deck space for outside dining or leisure opportunities.
- The Dining room has seating for up to 100 people with expansion options for up to 125.
- WiFi is available throughout the lodge. But we are in rural Montana, and the internet can be spotty.
- At quad occupancy per room, the Spruce Lodge can house 60 total people overnight.
- **The Rustic Camp** (aka Lower Camp) is a wonderful lakeside lodging option for those desiring a more rustic overnight experience, or for youth and younger families.
- Available lodging options within the camp include:
 - The Lake Lodge, Facility Building. two small multi-purpose rooms and two small bedrooms. Two single stool restrooms and one shower on the lower level.
 - *3 Alpine Row Cabins, each with 5 bunk beds (10 people per cabin) *(currently offline)
 - 3 Glacier Slip Cabins with 4 bunk beds each plus 1 twin (9 people per cabin)
 - 4 Water Way Cabins (KOA-style) each with 2 rooms and 7 beds per cabin
 - Each cabin cluster has a bathhouse with toilets and showers within walking distance. *Participants are expected to provide their own linens and towels.
